In the celebrations of World Wildlife Week, ARANYA organised an offline workshop cum volunteer work and an online lecture in **collaboration with the National Zoological Park, Delhi.**

The online lecture was headed by Dr Sonali Ghosh and Priyanka Chaudhary where they delved on how a zoo is managed, how the definition of a conventional zoological park has come to change with the gaining momentum of animal rights. It is no longer a cage with trapped animals for entertainment but a place to give a secure home for rescued animals unfit for survival in the wild. It gives a chance for endangered species to increase their numbers through conservation breeding programs with better bloodline like Sangai Deer, Asiatic lions etc. They talked at length about the various departments of the zoo that help in its smooth operation everyday, how animals are taken care of by the medical team and keepers. The food, daily activities through enrichment plans are ensured for a healthy life of wild animals. The lecture also opened the way for student volunteers and shed light upon various facilities of the zoo. The existence of a database like ZIMS to keep track of all animals in zoos worldwide and constant efforts put in to prevent inbreeding depression in animals. From the wonderful immersion exhibit plan along with the equipment acquired by the zoo to how

we can work in zoos and various opportunities through Wildlife Sciences were also talked about. The event was remarkable and so was how patiently the speakers took the questions raised by the audience. The lecture interaction is going down as one of the highlights for the current academic year achievements of Aranya. As all good things must come to an end, the programme also did with a vote of thanks and now we wait for the debate competition on 7th October.



A fine approach of water audit that helps in quantifying the water flow delivered in the system to understand its use, check for the losses, and hence reach a step closer to the preservation of water resources was discussed, with the help of fine illustrations presented by her. An effective DIY to store rainwater and generate its harvesting at an individual level using the 'drum method' was descriptively explained. Contributing to the initiatives undertaken by the gov and being responsible citizens is a hope to reverse the depleting scenario of these environmental jewels. Dr. Khosla addressed all the queries and concluded on a positive note that if each individual considers the preservation of worldly resources its priority, nothing is unachievable. Department of Botany


The Department reverted to offline classes during the academic session 2021-22 for the first time since the start of the pandemic. All academic activities were conducted online till December 2021; thereafter, in January 2022, the offline classes recommenced. This transition involved its own challenges, in terms of getting students on campus and helping them get over their problems. To refresh the working knowledge of laboratory practices, two offline workshops — **Refresher Course in Lab Techniques** (February 7-11, 2022) and **Workshop on Digital Upskilling** (February 15-17, 2022) were organized for the laboratory staff. A detailed manual was also prepared for their reference. Various activities were organized online to keep students and faculty abreast with the latest developments in science. Workshops were organised on topics relevant to the undergraduate curriculum. Large participation was witnessed in these events.









DGLS SESSION 6 Gandhi's Critique of Violence

The session was chaired by Professor Usha Thakkar (Eminent Gandhian Scholar & President, Mani Bhavan). The session was attended by an overwhelming number of Gandhian enthusiasts and some eminent scholars.



Certificate Course Orientation

Activities/Events


