In the departmental meeting, the syllabus is discussed and papers		

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allotted, keeping in consideration the area of specialization, competence and research interest of the teachers. However, pandemic enforced new considerations. A delayed academic session for the newcomers meant a non-synchronous academic cycle with no respite from work for teachers. Thus, the workload was distributed and sessions were planned, adjusting to such novelties without compromising the quality of curriculum delivery.

COVID necessitated the use of ICT in unprecedented ways. Our college teamed up with Microsoft to provide our students with a secure online platform. All the students and faculties were provided with a secure Microsoft account to allay any security concerns. Microsoft conducted workshops for the teachers to acquaint them with the technical know-how required to deliver the curriculum seamlessly on the platform.

Despite a radical departure from the existing norms, we remained loyal to the mode of teaching that promotes active learning, dialogical-interactions, and critical-thinking. Our online classroom sessions and tutorials became an effective replacement to cater to the diverse needs of students representing a spectrum of interests, drives and potentialities. Further, webinars became a valuable mode to invite notable scholars and researchers in order to provide our students exposure to their valuable insights.

The IQAC of the college understands the importance of motivated faculty members for a seamless teaching-learning process. The faculty are encouraged to take up refresher courses and MOOCS to keep abreast of changes and to remain synchronised with the latest trends and techniques of imparting education.

To make the learning experience more fruitful for the students, we emphasise using audio-visual aids like PowerPoint presentations, videos, infographics, and other tools that not only help maintain students' attention PowerPoint presentations, videos, infographics, and other such tools that not only help to maintain the attention of students but also help them in grasping the concepts in a better way. Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies enhance learning experiences. Classroom learning is enriched by introducing real-world experiences through field trips (industry/museum/ hospital etc.), interaction with experts and scholars, etc., that enable students to relate better to the topic/course being taught. Quizzes and debates are organised through various specialized college societies to keep up the students' inquisitiveness. There are regular pre and post-lab sessions with students of science streams to assess the understanding and assimilation of students. The College offers addon courses in various disciplines for students to acquire additional knowledge and skills. Also, the College conducts regular counseling and career guidance sessions through its dedicated placements society.

In accordance with the University norms, 25 percent of the marks for each course are part of an internal assessment. The assessment process of students is aggregative and formative at the same time; marks are aggregated through the semester based on an extensive evaluation process that includes class tests, assignments, projects, group discussions, viva, presentations, etc. Students are also encouraged to participate in creative academic activities that delve into the curriculum. We believe that internalassessment of students is a continuous process that should take place throughout the period of any course, which may include regular oral/written evaluation sessions, followed by feedback sessions from their teachers. Those students who could not cope up with the class are given remedial classes and extra attention by the teachers in tutorial classes. In these classes, they are encouraged to clarify their doubts and queries. With high expectations from our students, teachers work tirelessly with them to ensure that the expected learning outcomes are achieved; teachers work tirelessly with their students to ensure that the desired learning outcomes are achieved by providing them with additional assignments and practice papers, and mock exam papers. The process of internal assessment is implemented in such a way that it remains robust and transparent. The internal assessment marks are regularly submitted to the college by the concerned teacher, moderated by the departmental committees (wherever required), and then shared with the students to check their progress.

Translating an Innovative research idea into a realistic product has always been challenging. This is rendered possible through interdisciplinary research as was envisaged in the objectives of the Innovation project scheme started by the University of Delhi a few years back. The students have completed several innovation projects under the guidance of faculty and mentors at Zakir Husain Delhi College. College has adequate infrastructure for teaching and research. Sufficient number of classrooms, tutorial rooms, laboratories for Science, Commerce and Psychology students and

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library housing the multimedia laboratory are available to provide ample space to sanctioned number of students. College also has state of the art culture rooms and museums in Botany and Zoology departments. Besides, facilities are available to organize seminars and interactive session on large and small scales. For this, audio-visual room, seminar room and an auditorium of four hundred and fifty seating capacity is available. Seventy percent of the classrooms are equipped with ICT facility. The rooms are very well lit and ventilated to provideclean and comfortable environment for the teachers and students. Science laboratories are equipped with functional and properly maintained equipment and instruments to give hands on experience to students. A barrier free environment is created for Divyangjan. For this, elevated ramps and lifts are available in each section/block of the college. Lavatory facilities for Divyangjan are also available. Entire campus is wi-fi enabled. Students and faculty members can easily access the internet facility. College has four computer labs with over 1000 computers for students. In addition college has one computer literacy lab.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The college has sufficient number of technicians, electricians, plumbers, carpenters, attendants, who look after all the equipmentacross various departments, laboratories, computers. Many of the major equipmentlike generator sets, 5-10 KVA UPS, water purifier, the EPABX system and Xerox machines are kept under Annual Maintenance Contract.

All installed computers, laptops and networking across departments, libraries and administrative blocks are also under Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC). Thus any technical glitch or system snag is addressed and resolved immediately.

In the laboratories, all the attending staff ensures smooth functioning of equipment's throughout the year by periodic maintenanceusing scientific protocols. When College staff cannot deal with any significant error, technical help is sought from the same company which has provided the equipment. If any equipment is found to be unusable, it is disposed of after following due procedure.

Dedicated ecological spaces like botanical, herbal garden, rock garden and playground are taken care of by the experienced and trained gardeners.

Due to long lockdown and restricted entry no regular maintenance activities could be undertaken in the College as well as College Library. However, activities like sanitization thrice a week , painting and whitewashing were performed during this period.

# 6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic/perspective plan is effectively deployed

ZHDC has always been swift in adopting technology, particularly ICT, to improve the learning experience of the students and to amplify the potential of our teachers. However, the pandemic necessitated the use of ICT in unprecedented ways. To ensure the continuity of effective teaching-learning process, the institution teamed up with Microsoft to provide our students with a secure online platform to continue their learning uninterruptedly. Microsoft-IDs for all the teachers and the students were prepared. To avoid repetitions, redundancies and confusion, student IDs were prefixed with their unique college roll numbers. The IDs were made available on the college website and passwords were distributed by the teachers to their students. A team of specialists was deployed to address the maintenance issues and the difficulties faced by the students and teachers to navigate through the new interface. Further, workshops were organized to acquaint teachers with the features of the platform. For the ease of students in locating their class, teachers were made responsible for adding students to the teams and scheduling the meetings. For the internalassessment, teachers relied on the platform for the submission of assignments and for sorting, marking, returning and maintaining the record of such submissions.

## **6.3 - Faculty Empowerment Strategies**

## 6.3.1 - The institution has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff

Teaching and non-teaching staff both have a facility of group insurance, medical reimbursement as per university rules, and reimbursement of school fees of children. A medical room facility and Psychological counseling are also provided to teachers in the college. They also have access to University Health Centre for consultation and getting medicines.

The Staff Association takes care of the welfare of teachers through financial assistance, social gatherings, and other welfare measures through the contribution of teachers. There is a facility of newspapers and magazines which are subscribed for teachers. The staff association also has a Staff Welfare Fund, a one-time exgratia provided to teachers who unfortunately die during service. The teachers contribute monthly while the University of Delhi manages the fund.

For non-teaching staff, there is a Karamchari Union, which takes care of the welfare of non-teaching staff through welfare measures by the contribution, financial assistance, social gatherings, and other help such as financial assistance at the time of medical emergency or death of the employee.

In 2020-2021, promotions for Assistant Professor (Stage 1 to Stage 2 and Stage 2 to Stage 3) and Assistant professor (Stage 3) to Associate Professor (Stage 4) were carried out at the college.

Appraisal of the non-teaching staff is done upon filling in the appraisal form as per the University guidelines. Staff members who fulfill the conditions in the performance appraisal proforma are promoted to the next stage as per the vacancy available. #### 6.4 - Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

The institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly.

Zakir Husain Delhi College does an internal audit every year. The internal audit is conducted by the Statutory Auditor (Chartered Accountant) hired by the college. The college submits a panel of three auditors to the College Governing Body, out of which one auditor is selected and appointed by the governing body to conduct an internal audit for the financial year. One firm is not permitted to audit for more than three years consecutively. The audit for the financial year 2020-21 has been done. The college maintains four accounts, namely (i) General Fund, which includes maintenance grant received from UGC, (ii) OBC Infrastructure Account received from UGC, (iii) Provident Fund for GPF, and (iv) Students fund, which has college funds. All these accounts are jointly operated by the Principal and Bursar of the college. The

auditor examines and checks Salary bills, LTC/HTC payments, purchases, income tax calculations of employees, verifies college bank balance with the bank certificates, etc.

External audit of the college is done by the Controller and Auditor General of India (CAG) at their discretion. The latest auditing has been done in January and February 2021 for the span of 2012-13 to 2019-20.

Statutory Committees- Academic Supervisory Committee and Time Table Committee held pre-session and in-session meetings and provided a master timetable with optimum utilization of classrooms, labs and manpower.

Staff Requirement Committee, a statutory committee of the college ensured smooth functioning by computing the workload assessment at the beginning of both semesters.

Career Counseling and Placement Cell of the college conducted a student development program on Python 3.4.3 and R in association with spoken tutorial, IIT Bombay. It also conducts two online counseling sessions. Due to the active participation of students, the college ranked 57 among 1500 other participants on the

internship day organized by 'INTERNSHALA'.

The College Library acquired and performed complete technical processing of 1403 books using LSEase 7 ILMS besides acquiring 23 Newspapers and 35 Magazines in different languages. As per usual annual practice, Stock Verification was also performed by the Library. The Library also assisted the Faculty members in obtaining Remote Access to the Electronic Resources subscribed by the DULS during COVID-19 Lockdown period.

- Solid waste management: The college has been practicing garbage segregation since 2005 by using green bins for organic waste and blue bins for non-biodegradable waste. Organic waste, including leaves, shrubs and canteen etc., are converted into compost in our vermicompost unit and used for the college garden.

Only steel utensils and plates of eco-friendly material are allowed in the college canteen. Ceramic and glass cups are used in the staff kitchen for serving beverages to reduce solid waste, such as paper or thermocol plates.

- E-waste management: We have collaborated with an NGO, "Chintan," to recycle e-waste. Students and staff are encouraged to put their discarded phones, batteries, old laptops, etc., in the boxes provided by the "Chintan" and are kept in college for e-waste collection.
- Waste recycling system: Alongside a paperless administration, the college also encourages recycling used paper. Apart from a handmade paper unit within the college used for recycling paper, we have also tied up with the "Jaagruti," an organisation that recycles large quantities of paper.
- Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management: Microbial culture is always autoclaved after use so that unwanted microbes do not spread in the tissue culture lab. Colchicines, a carcinogenic compound, are no longer given to students to handle. Hazardous waste from electronic items is collected by the "Chintan" for treatment.

Likewise, Vidya-Devi-Education-Fundfor the economically marginalized and Sri-Narain-Nigam-Memorial-Scholarshipfor the PwD have been instituted to make education accessible and affordable. We are sensitive to the special needs of PwD and have made necessary infrastructural arrangements to facilitate ease of access for them. For instance, a dedicated computer is provided in the library, connected with Lex-Scanner and headphones for the VH students. Likewise, a laptop with JAWS software, an Angel device, is available and three annual magazines in the braille format are also subscribed. The college website is friendly for visually challenged students.

Further, we celebrate and encourage cultural, linguistic, and regional diversity by organizing festivals and events and facilitating the formation of various cultural associations such as the Bengali Literary Society, Arts and Culture Society, North-Eastern Students' Association, and Malayali Students' Association.
