The Staff Council and the Principal of the college constitute committees for the smooth implementation and delivery of the curriculum. An intensive planning and coordination between these committees ensure the optimal utilisation and distribution of available resources for fulfilling the requirements of curriculum delivery. The area of specialisation, research interests, academic qualification, and teaching experience are taken into consideration by each department while allotting papers. The task of preparing time tables for different departments is undertaken keeping in mind the size and availability of classrooms for lectures, tutorials, and practicals. This planning for curriculum delivery has a direct bearing on the outcome of a course as stated in the LOCF. Teachers employ the modes of teaching that are tailored to the needs of individual students. An emphasis is placed on lowering the student-teacher ratio and small tutorial groups are formed for this purpose. Our college library not only provides students free access to textbooks, reference books, research journals, and e-resources but also keeps updating the existing stock of books as per changes in

the syllabi. Most of our classrooms are equipped with the state-of-the-art technology. A flexible feedback mechanism is available in our college for the assessment of curriculum delivery.

Zakir Husain Delhi College adhered to the academic calendar mandated by the University of Delhi. In spite of the Pandemic COVID-19 which, induced the certain departures from norm due to unavoidable delayed admissions of the first year entrants, Our College has left no stone unturned to offer convenient synchronized semesters commencing and ending at different times in the same academic session without compromising the requirement of 30 weeks (180 Days) of teaching days as well as its standard according to the UGC guidelines. The college followed the guidelines circulated by the University of Delhi regarding normal division of semester constituting two stretches of teaching weeks on either side of a mid-semester break. Each semester entails with preparatory leaves and practical exams, followed by theoretical exam conducted by the University. During both semesters, internal assessments are made employing a wide range of mode including viva-voce, classtests, assignments, quizzes and paper presentations etc. to examine and enhance the understanding of the students and provide them with feedback. Our Faculty members kept providing teaching content and other supporting material including audio, video and presentation files through ICT particularly the Microsoft Team especially during the Covid-19 period

The IQAC of the college understands the importance of motivated faculty members for a seamless teaching-learning process. The faculty are encouraged to take up refresher courses and MOOCS to keep abreast of changes and to remain synchronised with the latest trends and techniques of imparting education. To make the learning experience more fruitful for the students, we emphasise using audio-visual aids like PowerPoint presentations, videos, infographics, and other tools that not only help maintain students' attention PowerPoint presentations, videos, infographics, and other such tools that not only help to maintain the attention of students but also help them in grasping the concepts in a better way. Studentcentric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies enhance learning experiences. Classroom learning is enriched by introducing real-world experiences through field trips (industry/museum/ hospital etc.), interaction with experts and scholars, etc., that enable students to relate better to the topic/course being taught. Quizzes and debates are organised through various specialized college societies to keep up the students' inquisitiveness. There are regular pre and post-lab sessions with students of science streams to assess the understanding and assimilation of students. The College offers addon courses in various disciplines for students to acquire additional knowledge and skills. Also, the College conducts regular counseling and career guidance sessions through its dedicated placements society.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

In accordance with the University norms, 25 percent of the marks for each course are part of an internal assessment. The assessment process of students is aggregative and formative at the same time; marks are aggregated through the semester based on an extensive evaluation process that includes class tests, assignments, projects, group discussions, viva, presentations, etc. Students are also encouraged to participate in creative academic activities that delve into the curriculum. We believe that internal assessment of students is a continuous process that should take place throughout the period of any course, which may include regular oral/written evaluation sessions, followed by feedback sessions from their teachers. Those students who could not cope up with the class are given remedial classes and extra attention by the teachers in tutorial classes. In these classes, they are encouraged to clarify their doubts and queries. With high expectations from our students, teachers work tirelessly with them to ensure that the expected learning outcomes are achieved; teachers work tirelessly with their students to ensure that the desired learning outcomes are achieved by providing them with additional assignments and practice papers, and mock exam papers. The process of internal assessment is implemented in such a way that it remains robust and transparent. The internal assessment marks are regularly submitted to the college by the concerned teacher, moderated by the departmental committees (wherever required), and then shared with the students to check their progress.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has impressive infrastructure for teaching-learning and research facilities. It has sufficient well-lit and ventilated classrooms, tutorial rooms, and laboratories for students of all streams. Science laboratories are equipped with functional and properly maintained instruments and equipment to give hands on experience to students. The college has state of art culture rooms and museum in botany and zoology departments. The college has centrally airconditioned library which also houses the multimedia laboratory and separate study rooms for teachers. Seminars, workshops, interactive sessions are organized periodically in audio visual room, seminar room and an ultra-modern auditorium of four hundred and fifty seating capacity. Most of the classrooms are equipped with ICT facility. A barrier free environment is created for Divyangjan and elevated ramps and lifts are available in each section/block of the college. Lavatory facilities are also

available for Divyangjan. Entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled so that students and faculty members can easily access the internet facility. The college has four computer labs with over 100 computers for students. In addition, college has one computer literacy lab. There is a common staff rooms provided with locker facilities for arts and commerce teachers besides individual departmental faculty rooms for science teachers.

With frequent and regular upgradation of courses, college hugely relies on open access softwares which can be installed with the existing IT infrastructure in college. Our college has set up a strong networking and IT support system to facilitate students not only to learn on campus but also through live streaming/demonstration of laboratory experiments and online classes . Apart from digital teaching learning, administrative activities also require strong IT infrastructure. Hence, we ensure that networking and other IT sources are regularly updated. Wi-Fi networking has been provided in the campus by Delhi University. However, we have installed hubs in different corners like science block, administrative block, principal office which are centrally monitored by college networking station. Computers in the science departments, administrative blocks, computer laboratories, science laboratories, library have been connected either through ethernet cable or dongles (wireless connector). Computers/laptops are used extensively by the students since the new courses in DSE, GE, SEC and core courses lay emphasis on computational skills development as envisaged in the revised syllabi for undergraduate classes.

The college has formed various committees for the maintenance of physical, academic, and sports facilities. The purchase committee ensures the purchase of required equipment whereas the maintenance committee oversees construction, repair, and renovation. Many of the major equipment like generator sets, 5-10 KVA ups, water purifiers, the EPABX system, and xerox machines are kept under an annual maintenance contract. All installed computers, laptops and networking across departments,

libraries, and administrative blocks are also under annual maintenance contracts (AMC). In the laboratories, the attending staff ensures the smooth functioning of the equipment throughout the year by periodic maintenance using scientific protocols. If any equipment is found to be unusable, it is disposed of after due procedure. The room upgradation committee takes care of the maintenance and upgradation of classrooms. The college has a full-time electrician, plumber, and carpenter to ensure the smooth functioning of laboratories, electrical equipment, and infrastructure. The S.O. (administration) supervises sanitary and security staff. The I.T. committee looks after the computer, laptops, and software. The library committee supervises the purchase of books, magazines and journals. Dedicated ecological spaces like botanical, herbal, rock , college gardens and playgrounds are taken care of by garden committee and gardeners.

Zakir Husain Delhi College practices decentralization and participative management practices. The governing body at its helm provides ample support for the financial and infrastructural facilities. Principal steers the college toward attaining higher standards. The college has an active Staff Council, Staff Association, Students Council, and a robust committee system that ensures stakeholders' active participation in democratic decision-making. A definite and inclusive committee system operates in the institution that takes care of the college's academic, extracurricular, and administrative aspects. The Staff Council committees include Academic Supervisory Committee, Staff Requirement Committee, Proctorial Board, Timetable Committee, Student Aid Committee, and Art and Culture Committee. A medical room facility and Psychological counseling are also provided to teachers in the college. They also have access to University Health Centre for consultation and getting medicines. The internal audit is conducted by the Statutory Auditor (Chartered Accountant) hired by the college. The college submits a panel of three auditors to the College Governing Body, out of which one auditor is selected and appointed by the governing body to conduct an internal audit for the financial year. One firm is not permitted to audit for more than three years consecutively. The audit for the financial year 2020-21 has been done. The college maintains four accounts, namely (i) General Fund, which includes maintenance grant received from UGC, (ii) OBC Infrastructure Account received from UGC, (iii) Provident Fund for GPF, and (iv) Students fund, which has college funds. All these accounts are jointly operated by the Principal and Bursar of the college. The auditor examines and checks Salary bills, LTC/HTC payments, purchases, income tax calculations of employees, verifies college bank balance with the bank certificates, etc.
