1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process		
ZHDC, affiliated with the University of Delhi, adheres to university curriculum guidelines, allocating lectures and tutorials accordingly. Each department conducts discussions and allocates the subjects based on faculty expertise and research interests. Despite delays due to extended admissions, the college		

managed workload and scheduling efficiently to maintain curriculum quality. Committees like the Time Table and Academic Supervisory Committees support academic programs and welfare initiatives.

The COVID-19 pandemic prompted unprecedented ICT usage, facilitating hybrid learning. The shift to the National Education Policy (NEP) focused on holistic education and active participation, necessitating online induction programs. In order to induct the students with the various aspects of the NEP, Orientation Programmes for SEC and VAC were conducted by the respective authorities. Furthermore, the college faculty attended various FDPs organised by various colleges under the University of Delhi which aided in providing wider subject knowledge accommodating the varying requirements of students with a wide range of interests, motivations, and potentials.

ZHDC integrates assessment into the learning process by following university guidelines. Students are encouraged to assess their own writing, promoting an understanding of evaluation process and facilitating self-reflection for potential enhancements. This approach ensures both assessment and ongoing improvement in the student's learning journey.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Zakir Husain Delhi College is dedicated to fostering the comprehensive development of students, encompassing intellectual, social, emotional, and aesthetic aspects and therefore, diligently strives to evaluate and improve its teaching methods.

The college strictly follows the academic calendar set by the University of Delhi, although it experienced disruptions due to COVID-related late admissions for first-year students, the college adapted by having synchronized semesters that started and ended at different times within the same academic session. Importantly, it ensured compliance with the UGC's requirement of 30 weeks (180 days) of teaching. Each semester typically consists of two stretches of teaching weeks separated by a mid-semester break. During these semesters, various assessment methods, such as viva-voce, class tests, assignments, and paper presentations, are employed to evaluate and enhance students' comprehension while providing them with feedback. To cultivate critical and innovative thinking, the department employs student-centered pedagogies which embraces various approaches like providing case studies to students, holding brainstorming sessions, with the support of ICT and other electronic devices. The college prospectus outlines the evaluation process, and it is reiterated in subsequent classes to ensure the internal assessment is effectively carried out. Students undergo continuous assessment using modernized methods like group discussions, assignments, analytical tests, practicals, and projects.

The semester concluded with preparatory leave and practical exams, followed by theoretical exams conducted by the University.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Zakir Husain Delhi College is committed to impart meaningful quality education to enhance the learning abilities of the students. We understand, appreciate and support differential learning paces of all learners for which continuous assessments of our students via oral/written tests, assignments and PowerPoint presentations are conducted. This has a main intention of formulating ways and means of ensuring learning equity amongst students who may have different learning capacities.

The institution recognizes that the class is a combination of students with different abilities and needs, so teachers will provide appropriate scaffolding as needed. Classes are divided into smaller groups, known as tutorials, which provide the opportunity to identify learners' needs and problems. Also, if a learner needs additional support, the professors take extra initiatives to develop individualized learning opportunities. A remedial-class includes extra assignments to help them overcome academic difficulties. Sharing additional reference material, bilingual explanations or discussions help immensely.

We have set up a "mentor-mentee" system that allows students to contact their mentors if they have a problem, at any level. There is also an active Student Aid Committee dedicated solely to ensuring that no student suffers academic disadvantage due to financial hardships.

The diverse characters of students are also catered for by reinforcing classroom teaching through innovative pedagogical methods such as group activities, research, projects, publications, interactions with academics and peers. Various clubs and societies at the college ensure that students are engaged academically and in co-curricular activities. All these activities are well organized.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The IQAC of the college recognizes the importance of motivated faculty members for a smooth teaching and learning process. The faculty members are encouraged to attend refresher courses and MOOCS to keep pace with the changes and stay abreast with the latest trends and techniques in imparting education.

To make the learning experience more fruitful for students, we emphasize the use of audio-visual aids such as PowerPoint presentations, videos, infographics and other tools that not only maintain students' attention but also help them understand the concepts better. Student-centered methods such as experiential learning, participatory learning and problem-solving methods enhance the learning experience. Classroom learning is enriched by introducing real world experiences through field trips (industry/museum/hospital etc.), interaction with experts and scientists etc. which enable students to relate better to the subject/course being taught. To keep the curiosity of the students alive, quiz games and debates are organized by various specialized college societies. There are regular pre and post sessions with science students to assess the understanding and assimilation of the students. The college also conducts regular counseling and career guidance sessions through its special society for internships.

Students are encouraged to use e-resources for research and reading. The teaching staff are well versed in the use of ICT and use of resources available on the internet very effectively.

The college is also very keen to sensitize students on the use and misuse of the internet and has conducted workshops to protect students from possible misuse and exploitation. Presentations have become part of the teaching and assessment process for most programs. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

In accordance with the New Education Policy- 2020 and University of Delhi norms, 25 percent of the marks for each course are part of an internal assessment. The internal assessment of students is conducted at the end of each unit by giving them tests/ assignments/quizzes. To ensure the robustness and frequency of assessments, projects, group discussions, viva, presentations, etc.are also held from time to time.

Some departments of the college assess their students on the basis of the reports submitted by them for the field trips, educational excursions and institutional and industrial visits undertaken.

In addition, tutorial classes are held to assess students throughout the semester and simultaneously their doubts and queries are clarified. This makes the assessment process regular and continuous at the same time. In the practical classes a similar pattern of continuous evaluation is followed wherein students' work in every lab is marked and assessed and their doubts are also discussed.

The internal assessment marks are regularly submitted to the college by the concerned professor which are then moderated by the departmental moderation committees (current TIC, previous TIC and senior most faculty member), and then it is made available online for the students to verify. Also in case, students find any evaluation grievances then they get in touch with the concerned Professor for the correction. The assessment of appeals are efficiently addressed within a specific time-frame.

The college proficiently handles all the internal evaluation grievances skilfully, effectively and in a time bound manner. The college follows all of the set guidelines and rules issued by the University of Delhi very clearly and precisely, including the assessment process from time to time. Hence, the college maintains a transparent and robust internal assessment and examination process.

The college follows a systematic approach for the attainment of program and course outcomes of all the courses offered by the institution. Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) and National Education Policy -Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (NEP-UGCF) courses define intended learning outcomes for the entire course of each paper. These are clearly stated on the college website and communicated to all the teachers and students. At the beginning of the academic session, each department holds an orientation program where the expected course outcomes are explained to the students in detail.

Keeping in view the needs of the students and emerging

requirements of current times, a fine balance of age-old tried and tested methods and modern ICT tools is used by the faculty members for the attainment of the desired learning outcomes. With high expectations from our students, professors work tirelessly with their students to ensure that the desired learning outcomes are achieved by providing them with additional assignments and practice papers. Small group discussions, tutorials presentations and practical labs lend the required additional support and reinforcement for the same.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

The continuous evaluation in practical papers in science courses is carried out on the basis of attendance, assessment of the working of the students in each lab class and the record files of the work done.

The NEP-UGCF courses introduced from the session 2022-23 also have defined LOs and COs for each course and paper. The attainment of these is also covered through continuous evaluation and semester end examinations. In this pattern, each credit carries 40 marks out of which 25% (10 marks) are for internal assessment and 75% (30 marks) for final examinations. Further, out of the 10 marks for internal assessment 2 marks are for attendance and 8 for tests and assignments. Depending on the credits that a particular course carries, the above marks vary from one course to the other. However, the 25% : 75% division remains.

The orientation programs held by each department at the beginning of the session help the students understand the desired LOs and COs and the criteria and objectives of assessment. The students are given regular assignments and feedback about their performance and helped to overcome their shortcomings.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

College possesses sufficient infrastructure and physical amenities to support the teaching and learning processes, including classrooms, laboratories, and computing equipment. The college boasts impressive facilities for both teaching and research, ensuring a conducive environment for students across all disciplines. Well-lit and well-ventilated classrooms, tutorial spaces, and laboratories are available. The science laboratories are equipped with well-maintained instruments, providing students with hands-on learning experiences. Notably, the college features state-of-the-art culture rooms and a museum within the botany and zoology departments.

The college's library accommodates a multimedia laboratory and dedicated study areas for teachers. Various academic events, such as seminars and workshops, take place in well-equipped spaces like the audio-visual room, seminar room, and an auditorium having seating capacity of four hundred and fifty. Majority of classrooms are equipped with ICT facilities, ensuring technological support for education. The campus is barrier-free, with elevated ramps and lifts available in each section or block for Divyangjan. Moreover, lavatory facilities are readily accessible, contributing to a comfortable environment for all.

The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled, facilitating easy internet access for both students and faculty. The college houses four computer labs with over 100 computers dedicated to student use, complemented by a computer literacy lab.

The institution possesses ample amenities for cultural activities, sports, both indoor and outdoor games and a yoga centre. Zakir Husain Delhi College places significant emphasis on extracurricular pursuits, encompassing indoor and outdoor sports, debates, music, theatre, dance, and drama. The college's well-kept playground traditionally used for cricket and football matches and practices is currently inaccessible due to the maintenance of the new building. As a result, students are temporarily directed to external grounds for football, cricket, and basketball practice.

A versatile room is allocated for carom, chess, table tennis, judo, and weight training sessions. Chess and carom facilities are also available as recreational activities in the common rooms for both girls and boys. Yoga classes take place in the Auditorium foyer. The arts and culture society members receive expert training and have access to the arts and culture room, Auditorium, and Auditorium foyer for practice and various cultural activities. The Auditorium includes two green rooms and two toilets. An appropriately furnished arts and culture room with classical and modern musical instruments is well-lit and air-conditioned for students' comfort. Additionally, the College terrace serves as a venue for street plays.

The Library users are regularly been provided orientation and training in using WebOPAC for the purpose of searching and locating their required books.

Usually, last Saturday of every month is dedicated for the training of the subordinate Library Staff in using modern ICT tools and techniques being implemented in the profession for providing best possible services to the Library users. The Library Staff is also imparted knowledge about the basics of the Library & Information Science besides clearing their doubts.

With the implementation of the national education policy for higher education, emphasizing digital pedagogy, ZHDC has significantly bolstered its IT infrastructure. Currently the college boasts seven state-of-the-art digital laboratories. The entire academic and administrative space within the college has seamlessly integrated ICT. Classrooms, auditorium, library, AV and seminar room are equipped with PowerPoint projectors. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled. All computers and laptops throughout the college, including administrative sections, the library, computer and science laboratories, are connected via Ethernet cables and dongles. Hubs are installed in different corners of the college which are centrally monitored by College networking station. Staff, students and faculty members are furnished with laptops, desktops, printers, and scanners, which play pivotal roles in the VAC, SEC, GE, DSC and DSE courses in accordance with NEP. Furthermore, the college has deployed software applications for admission procedures, administration, library automation, timetable management, e-content, internal assessments, and student academic records. ZHDC has emerged as a pioneering institution within the University of Delhi by adopting Microsoft Teams for online teaching, learning, and meetings, and has also embraced

platforms such as Google Classroom, Meet, Skype etc to enrich the teaching and learning experiences, aligning with the requirements of the NEP.

College has established systems and protocols for the upkeep and utilization of its physical, academic, and support facilities, which include laboratories, library, sports, computers, and classrooms. Committees have been constituted to manage the maintenance of these facilities. The Purchase Committee is responsible for acquiring necessary equipment, while the Maintenance Committee oversees construction, repair, and renovation activities. Equipment, such as generators, UPS, water purifiers, the EPABX system, and xerox machines, are covered by annual maintenance contracts. Similarly, all computers, laptops, and networking infrastructure across departments, libraries, and administrative blocks are also under AMC. Within the laboratories, the staff ensures the smooth functioning of equipment through regular maintenance following scientific protocols. If any equipment becomes unusable, it is disposed of following established procedures. The Room Upgradation Committee focuses on maintaining and upgrading classrooms. The college employs an electrician, plumber, and carpenter to ensure the proper functioning of laboratories, electrical equipment, and infrastructure. The S.O. (administration) oversees sanitary and security staff, while the I.T. Committee manages computer systems, laptops, and software. The Library Committee supervises the acquisition of books, magazines, and journals. Dedicated ecological spaces, such as botanical, herbal, rock gardens, and playgrounds, are maintained by the Garden Committee and dedicated gardeners.

A medical room facility and Psychological counseling are also provided to teachers in the college. They also have access to University Health Centre for consultation and getting medicines. In 2020- 2021, promotions for Assistant Professor (Stage 1 to Stage 2 and Stage 2 to Stage 3) and Assistant professor (Stage 3) to Associate Professor (Stage 4) were carried out at the college. The internal audit is conducted by the Statutory Auditor (Chartered Accountant) hired by the college. The college submits a panel of three auditors to the College Governing Body, out of which one auditor is selected and appointed by the governing body to conduct an internal audit for the financial year. One firm is not permitted to audit for more than three years consecutively. The audit for the financial year 2022-23 has been done. The college maintains four accounts, namely (i) General Fund, which includes maintenance grant received from UGC, (ii) OBC Infrastructure Account received from UGC, (iii) Provident Fund for GPF, and (iv) Students fund, which has college funds. All these accounts are jointly operated by the Principal and Bursar of the college. The auditor examines and checks Salary bills, LTC/HTC payments, purchases, income tax calculations of employees, verifies college bank balance with the bank certificates, etc.

The institution employs a comprehensive waste management system, utilizing color-coded dustbins for efficient solid waste segregation. These bins are strategically placed across the premises to encourage proper disposal of degradable and nondegradable waste, promoting responsible waste management practices.

Liquid waste, such as sewage and wastewater, is directed to municipal sewers in compliance with environmental regulations. The institution ensures that liquid waste is treated appropriately before being discharged to minimize its impact on the environment.

In handling biomedical waste, the institution adheres to stringent protocols for collection, segregation, and disposal. Specialized containers are provided in healthcare facilities within the institution to segregate biomedical waste, preventing crosscontamination and ensuring safe disposal methods.

For e-waste management, the institution collaborates with the NGO "Chintan," which specializes in responsible e-waste disposal. This partnership emphasizes the proper recycling and disposal of electronic equipment, reducing the environmental impact of electronic waste.

The institution has also partnered with "Jaagruti," an organization dedicated to paper recycling. They operate a paper recycling system on the premises, which includes a handmade paper recycling machine. This initiative promotes sustainability by reducing the consumption of new paper and minimizing the environmental footprint associated with paper production.

Lastly, the institution prioritizes the management of hazardous chemicals. Strict protocols are in place for the safe handling, storage, and disposal of such materials, ensuring compliance with regulatory standards and safeguarding the health and well-being of the community and the environment.
